Industry accountability

S.1653 / H.2672 An Act relative to firearm industry accountability and gun violence victims' access to justice

- **Senate Sponsor:** Senator Cynthia Stone Creem
- House Sponsor: Representative Frank A. Moran
- Details: Would allow individuals and entities harmed by firearm industry members' wrongful and unlawful conduct the option to pursue civil actions seeking appropriate justice, fair compensation, and other remedies for those harms in court.

Unsolved homicides

S.2177 / H.4114 An Act relative to unsolved homicides

- Senate Sponsor: Senator Liz Miranda
- House Sponsors: Representative Russell E. Holmes, Representative Bud L.
 Williams
- Details: Establishes an office of unsolved homicides within the Attorney
 General's office. This bill would allow immediate family members of
 Massachusetts homicide victims, whose cases have been unsolved for over
 three years, to request the unsolved homicides office to review the case and see
 if further investigation could result in new leads or identify a possible suspect.

Juvenile justice reform and supporting system-involved youth <u>S.1061</u> / <u>H.1923</u> An Act to promote public safety and better outcomes for youth

- **Senate Sponsor:** Senator Brendan P. Crighton
- House Sponsors: Representative James J. O'Day, Representative Manny Cruz
- Details: This bill, also known as the "Raise the Age" bill, increases the age at
 which a young person is considered an adult in the eyes of the justice system.
 This bill would keep 18-20 year olds in the juvenile justice system instead of the
 adult justice system, where they receive more developmentally appropriate and
 supportive services.
